



What to bring to Wag It Camp

For you:

Bedding – Pillow, twin size sheets, Warm blanket or sleeping bag

Towels for the beach and bath

Swimwear

(If participating in water workshops - wet suit (prevents accidental scratches, swim fins and a life jacket make this all easier)

Toiletries

Medications

Personal physician's name, contact information, medical and medication list

Flashlight

Sunscreen

Bug repellent

Rain gear (hopefully it will not be needed)

Clothing that may be layered (We could have hot or cool days and chilly evenings)

Water bottle

Alarm clock

Chair to bring to workshop sites

Your smile and laughter

For your dog:

Dog Crate

Towels

Leash (non retractable)

Food and bowls for your dog

Collar with ID

Veterinarian's name, contact information, medical and medication list

Training treats and toys

If participating in water skills workshops- dog life jacket (required), small floating toy, floating treats, floating retrieve item

If you are participating in Dog Ball Workshops- An exercise ball that is sized so the widest portion of the ball is approximately the height of your dogs nose

A wagging tail and dog kisses

Other suggested options:

Fan- There is no AC in the cabins. If we have hot nights you may appreciate a fan.

Small ceramic heater –The cabins are not heated and though it should be warm and you have a ceramic heater it may be appreciated if we have a chilly night

Egg crate or memory foam pad for extra comfort – Cabins do have basic matrices
